## Staff Funding Requests

Mrs. Wirtjes came in for second grade. The second grade team would like to take the students to the Indian Creek Nature Center in May as part of their plants and insects unit. The cost is $\$ 3.50$ per student. This is over their field trip budget since they also went the the lowa Children's Museum. Motion was made and approved to pay for the field trip.

## Library

As of now, the tables and chairs have been ordered. There was $\$ 4,000$ from PTO, $\$ 4,000$ from the Intermec grant and some of the library funds were used to cover the costs. Before Read A Thon, a motion was passed to spend $\$ 6,100$ on soft furniture for the library. This $\$ 6,100$ is separate from the $\$ 4,000$ that has been spent on the tables and chairs. However, donations for

Read A Thon were much lower than budgeted. There is a need to reevaluate the numbers so that PTO has enough in the bank to cover costs at the start of next year. Box Tops also did not get turned in on time so we are not getting the money for those. There is no longer a surplus in the PTO account as there has been in the past. Money has been used to fund the additional fourth section of kindergarten (mailboxes, mimioteach board, toys, games and a tent), Raz Kids reading program for kindergarten, first and fifth grade, new iPad for Mrs Stickney, tables and chairs in the library, art binders for Mr. Brandt, help funded the fifth grade book project, wood for drafting tables, gave Mrs. Kanz extra money to bring in School House Jazz for the entire school to enjoy, and a new thermometer for the nurse's office. All of these items have helped to spend the surplus to enrich our school.

## Fundraising

The exec team has been discussing different ways to fundraise for the next school year. We talked with a representative from Great American Fundraising. He would create a card with deals from a list of businesses we provide. People would also still be able to order the Enjoy the City coupon books online and there would be an app you can download that would also have deals in the cities you are visiting. This fundraising card would replace Enjoy the City.

Another option we have talked about was a check writing campaign tied in with Stride for Pride. Dawn Wonick has created different scenarios for the budget based on what level families donate. There was lots of discussion on how this would work and if more families would prefer this over three separate fundraisers throughout the year. The goal with the check writing campaign would be to only have to ask parents once to donate. A flyer would come home with details on the events that PTO pays for and how you can support the events. The consensus of the group was to do more research on doing a check writing campaign.
